Treasurer's Report	Council: Balance – \$ 12,529.35 Livestock: Balance – \$ 53,769.04 - 9 outstanding checks for 54k. Caleb Wareham, Corbin Thompson, 3 Petre checks, Corbin Thompson, Irene Edwards, Grady Chambers as of the end of Oct. David will follow-up. Budget request was made of Foundation, but no quorum. Individual that is a new volunteer would like to help with bookkeeping. Ariana Chapman. Erin would like to reach out and train her. Council had no issue with this so Erin will work with her.	
Committee Reports Extension Office Outdoor Indoor Youth Council/Ambassadors Foundation Clubs Building Committee Awards Committee Nominations Committee Other	 Extension Office: Treaters and Feeders club disbanded. Blanket drive – blankets will need to go in tubs in the BHB. The Extension office is out of storage space. No 4-H agent yet. Going out for round 3. Lexi is out until Monday. Awards from Awards Night on table. Take them with if they are in your club. Outdoor Committee: Beef tagging scheduled Jan. 2 10-noon. Any beef not tagged by noon then they will be ineligible. Arrangements must be made for a prior time if they are unable to be there that day. Asking Council for \$2,500 for a new tagging system. RFID tagging will come with a wand to track details contained in tag. This includes a pocket reader as a backup, plus 500 tags to get started. These would be for all species. Tamper proof. The wand reader will also find the tag in the pen. Would like to get this ordered to be ready for tagging in Jan. Move away from carcass evaluation and instead move to ultrasound. All livestock animals would be able to compete in the competition. Results take a week to a week and a half to come back so no impact on fair judging. This would be a rule change. Planning to discuss at Jan. Council meeting with a vote in Feb. if Livestock Committee moves forward. Outdoor Committee has scrapped the livestock pictures. Brainstorming other ways to thank the buyers. If kids want pictures, they will need to take their own. Considering setting up a selfie spot. The current picture money that comes out of checks will be moved to the new method of thanking buyers. No Outdoor meeting in Dec. Next meeting will be Jan. 3 @ 5:30.
