 - Jenne commented that Zoom is not conducive to when the host can't be present to start the meeting. It has caused a lot of issues.
 - David commented that Zoom and TEAMS have pluses and minuses. If struggling on one platform will probably struggle on another.
- OWL Audio/Visual tool may be checked out from the office. It is a very expensive tool.
 Keep with you and return to Extension, do not leave in BHB. It cannot be left in a
 vehicle to freeze or overheat. Choose camera and audio as OWL. Plugs right into
 computer.

- Awarded a grant to buy a drone for honeybee project. Kara will be sending out a signup for kids who want to participate.
