A workshop is an educational exercise led by a project sup. It will be up to the sup to determine specifics of the workshop. That means that every project must have workshops. Every livestock sup, market, will be affected. Beef, Swine, Goat, Sheep, Rabbit, poultry. There must be enough workshops for each project, for each kid to have at least 2. The weigh ins would count. An overall outdoor workshop would count for all species. There will be ample opportunities for kids to participate.
