- Extension Report Emily emailed the farmers union info to beef kids. Its free you just have to register to attend. Emily would like to do all in person quality assurance for members. Will set dates soon. Reminded sups to turn in 2 junior and 2 seniors for the above and beyond award for each project. Volunteer award nominations are still open for nominees. Reminded everyone to submit newsletter articles by the 4th Monday of the month. There will be no blank spots in the newsletter if you don't submit something it will be removed from the newsletter. Michelle suggested the website isn't user friendly. Lexi will try emailing the direct link out. Emily asked sups to sign up for open house. She attended a home school event and there are about 20 families interested in 4-H. Its October 8th from 1-3 pm. Emily and Lexi reviews the surveys from fair and the report showed the following: Try to close the barns to the public during the shows or sale; More workshops for the outdoor projects; can't show other people's animals; hold your cool around the youth members. Old Business:

- Fair AAR- Jamie explained the people said there was inconsistences with Pate Auction and try to keep kids in the ring longer. Everyone explained they donate their time every year. Vanessa wanted to know about open classes. Katie explained that is going away after this year no one to take it over. Emily had someone bring up shoes at round robin. Dave explained they have to be close toed, but can be what ever style kids want. Poultry and rabbit area worked very well being closed off with the gate. Work on how beef go in and out with gates and look at 2 people assigned to those gates. Can't close off because of fire hazard. Parade of beef will be different next year. Emily suggested having quality assurance for new members and parents. Emily will help and look at dates soon. Chris found syringes and paste tubes in the shavings. Look at blood testing steers or vet checks. Review book to make sure only market stay and no breeding excluding rabbits. Emily had a few kids reach out for feedback about round robin results. Jana mentioned have them contact her directly she has the notes.
